American Bar Association Dispute Resolution Section Names Husch Blackwell's John Phillips 2012-2013 Chair

The American Bar Association's Section of Dispute Resolution installed Husch Blackwell Partner John R. Phillips as 2012-2013 Chair at its annual meeting in early August. He will serve a one-year term in this position.

"At the Dispute Resolution Spring Conference in Chicago, April 3-6, 2013, more than 1,000 professionals involved in alternative dispute resolution will celebrate the 15th anniversary of the formation of the Section," Phillips said. "It's an honor to be leading a Section that has become such an important fixture in dispute resolution in America and internationally."

Phillips previously concentrated his work on labor and employment areas, but began mediating and arbitrating in 1992.
