OVERVIEW

Rachel focuses their practice on mass tort and product liability matters.

Rachel's journey to law was not a conventional one. They initially aspired to be an English as a Second Language teacher, driven by their own experience as an ESL student and their passion for leveling the playing field for others. However, their time teaching English in Thailand with the Peace Corps made them realize that they wanted to effect change on a systemic level, leading them to pursue a legal career.

Rachel's experience as an ESL tutor and teacher honed their ability to identify problems and create tailored solutions, a skill they now apply to their legal work. Their passion for teaching also influenced their law school experience, where they served as a teaching assistant for multiple writing classes and served as a board member and co-chair for the moot court team. Their involvement in moot court, including two competitions and later coaching, allowed them to further develop their advocacy skills.

During law school, Rachel also worked on an appeal before the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit as part of the Appellate Project. The challenging case was an invaluable learning opportunity, as was Rachel's externship with the California Supreme Court, where they researched both civil and criminal cases and drafted memos and recommendations.
